

Compact fluorescent light bulbs make a difference

Here's how!

- CFLs save energy — up to 75 percent savings over an incandescent bulb
- CFLs last longer — up to 10 times longer life
- Less heat output requires less energy use for cooling
- Newer CFLs offer more choices in light output (Lumens) and color (Degrees Kelvin) than earlier bulbs
- More variety of decorative designs and applications now available compared to earlier bulbs

Changing a light can change the world. It's true!

If every American home changed out five incandescent bulbs with energy-efficient CFL bulbs, each family would save about \$60 every year in energy costs, and together we'd save about \$6.5 billion each year in energy costs and prevent greenhouse gases equivalent to the emissions from more than eight million cars.

Just like old car batteries and computer equipment, old CFL's should be recycled
