STAY SAFE AROUND ELECTRICITY



It's easy to forget the dangers of electricity, but one mistake can have shocking consequences. Keep your home and loved ones safe with these tips:

Outlets — Replace loose or damaged electrical outlets immediately, and never overload outlets. Connecting too many plugs to one outlet could start a fire. Be sure your outdoor outlets have ground-fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection—the red and black buttons at the center of the outlet—to prevent a shock.

Cords — Only use cords that are undamaged and in good condition. If a cord is frayed or the insulation is cracked, throw it away and buy a new one. Preserving cord insulation is critical, so never nail or staple cords to any surface. Never yank the cord to unplug it; always grasp it by the connector.

Outdoor Safety — Never use electric cords or devices in the rain, on wet ground or in other excessively damp conditions. Make sure all tool, electric mower or outdoor fixture cords are in good condition and don't have any cracks, frays, exposed wires or broken housings. Replacing a damaged cord or buying a new tool altogether is an easy way to avoid potentially fatal consequences. Only use extension cords that are made for the outdoors and have an amperage rating high enough for your tools. Finally, always look up and avoid overhead power lines with tools and ladders.
