WATERING WISELY IS A WIN

Whether we're washing the car, raising a garden or running the dishwasher, water is a resource we all require and can use responsibly.

Although heavy spring storms built a strong snowpack this year, it's still wise to do your part to preserve our local reservoirs, waterways and aquifer.

Making a few small changes in the home and the yard when the weather is warm can save you money and help conserve the local water supply without sacrificing personal comfort.

First, avoid overwatering your lawn. Most lawns only require an inch of water per week, but the timing matters. Watering lawns and gardens in the early morning or evening when it's cool helps avoid evaporation and increase absorption. And remember to pause sprinkler schedules when the forecast calls for rain, some systems will even do that automatically.

Next, watch for and fix leaks right away. A leaky faucet washes money down the drain. Even tiny leaks can waste hundreds of gallons per month, but can often be fixed with the twist of a wrench.

High-efficiency showerheads and aerators are simple to install and significantly reduce the amount of water consumed while bathing or using the sink.

Using an Energy Star-rated dishwasher rather than hand washing dishes will reduce the time you spend standing at the sink and the amount of water that goes down the drain. Scraping dishes rather than rinsing them before loading the machine will save even more. Running a faucet for just a few minutes can use the same amount of water an efficient dishwasher uses in an entire cycle. And reducing use of hot water saves energy, too.

SAFEWATCH IS A SAFE GUARD FOR COMMUNITY

Since 1998, Clark Public Utilities and C-TRAN have worked together to provide the public a visible safety resource when help is needed, and many public service and emergency response agencies have joined the SafeWatch program to help keep our community safe.

Look for the SafeWatch sticker! And wave arms overhead to flag down help. Every utility vehicle is a SafeWatch vehicle. Once stopped, the driver can radio or call for assistance, and many are also trained in CPR and first aid.
