MAINTAINED SPRINKLERS MAKE EVERY DROP COUNT



Small steps go a long way to ensure your irrigation system doesn't waste water and drive up utility expenses. Here are some easy solutions to keep a sprinkler system working at its best.

Inspect it for leaks, pooling, malfunctioning heads, or blocked sensors and make repairs as needed.

Direct sprinkler heads toward the lawn and landscaping. Watering pavement is a waste.

Select a smart controller. They prevent overwatering by automating watering schedules and application volumes based on weather conditions and moisture needs, which can help lower monthly water bills.

Connect water-conserving sprinkler heads to maximize effective water application and reduce overwatering.

A SPECIAL GUEST BUZZES INTO UTILITY POLLINATOR GARDENS

The first sighting of an Apache cuckoo leafcutter bee (*Coelioxys apacheorum*) in Washington state was made at the Clark Public Utilities pollinator gardens. The bee was one of nearly 30 new or rare bee species recorded during the second year of the Washington State Department of Agriculture's Washington Bee Atlas.

The utility began adding pollinator friendly plants and gardens to our properties in 2021 when we launched the Pollinator Project. These gardens either replace previously un hospitable landscaping, turf grass or empty ground with low-maintenance flowering plants that support native bees, butterflies, hummingbirds and other pollinators in our community.

PUTTING THE SUMMER SUN TO GOOD USE

Beat the heat by using it to your advantage to help your home stay cool and save energy.



Hang-dry clothes. Hanging clothes to dry on a sunny summer day costs nothing and keeps indoor spaces cool. While quick and convenient, just one load in a clothes dryer can raise a room's temperature by several degrees. Plus, nearly half of its energy is wasted as heat loss.



Cook outdoors. Grills, barbecues, fire pits, and modular pizza ovens are delicious ways to eliminate major sources of residual indoor heat.



Put plants outside. The indoor greenhouse effect is great for houseplants but hard on people and pets. Moving plants outside helps them grow and allows you to cover the windows and keep indoor temperatures down.
